

10TH GRADE SCHEDULING

- All students must carry a minimum of 5.75 credits per school year
- Students must earn at least 4.25 credits to become a member of the sophomore class

Graduation Requirements:

- Completion of 21 credits to graduate
- Comprehensive Course Assessments (final exams for core courses)
- Successful Completion of a Senior Project

Course Requirements for Graduation:

• 4 from English	4 credits	You must pass these courses to graduate.
• 4 from Mathematics	4 credits	
• 3 from Science	3 credits	
• 1 from U.S. History	1 credit	
• 2 from Social Studies	2 credits	
• 4 years of P.E. (.5 credit per year)	2 credits	
• 4 years of Health (.25 credits per year)	1 credit	
• 1 credit in Fine Arts (Art or Music)	1 credit

You need to choose **at least 3 more credits.**

Students interested in a 4-year College:

Most colleges, URI and RIC included, require approximately **18 CORE ACADEMIC CREDITS** in the areas of English, Math, Science, Social Studies and Foreign Language with a grade of C or better. **Some colleges require more**, especially depending on your field of study.

• 4 credits from English	4 credits
• 4 from Math (Alg I, Geometry, Alg. II, Senior Math)	4 credits
• 3 Lab Science credits (Phys. Sci., Biology, Chemistry)	3 credits
• 1 from U.S. History	1 credit
• 2 from Social Studies	2 credits
• 2 Foreign Language (SAME) (Some require more)	2 credits
